Upon arrival at your hotel, check in and freshen up before dinner is included at the hotel restaurant this evening.



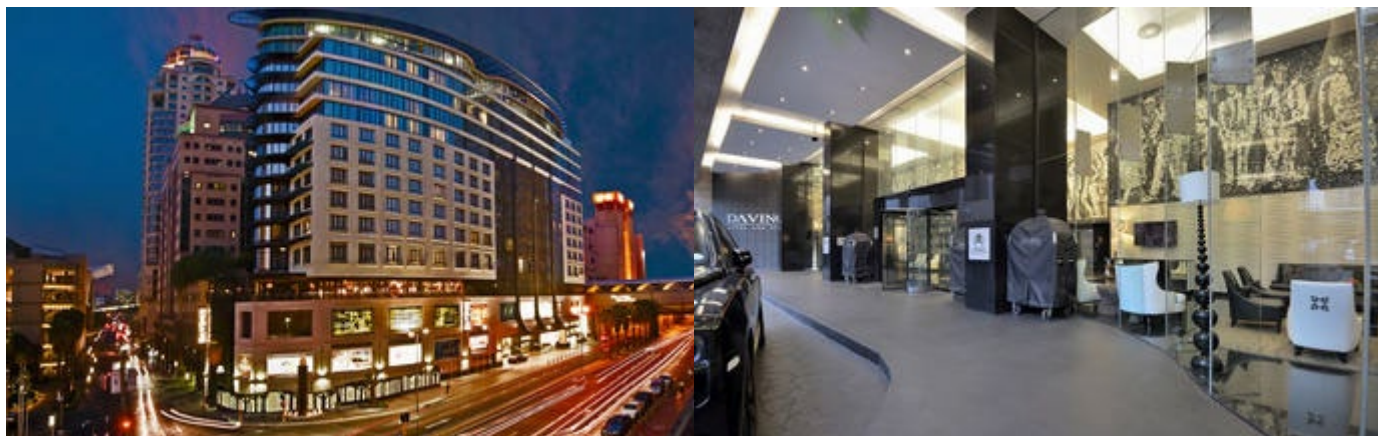

Day 2: DAVINCI Hotel & Suites Nelson Mandela Square, Johannesburg (Mon, 9 June)

Day Itinerary

Today you will do a Soweto Tour, including Mandela's House and lunch at Sakhumzi Restaurant, followed by a visit to the Voortrekker Monument in Pretoria, before heading back to the hotel to freshen up before dinner is served at the hotel.

The cosmopolitan city of Pretoria, also known as 'Tshwane', is situated in the province of Gauteng and functions as one of three capitals of South Africa. Pretoria has been dubbed 'The Jacaranda City', which is owed to the annual bloom of magnificent purple blossom trees that adorn the wide avenues of the city. Discover several historic monuments, fine government buildings, and fascinating museums, and explore several interesting cultural sites. The Transvaal Museum is a natural history museum showcasing an ancient dinosaur fossil found at the nearby Cradle of Humankind; the Pretoria Botanical Gardens offers visitors a glimpse of different biomes, and the Voortrekker Monument is a famous National Heritage Site. Don't miss the nearby Austin Roberts Bird Sanctuary as well as the beautiful Wonderboom and Groenkloof Nature Reserves.

Soweto

Bordering Johannesburg's mining belt, Soweto is a township of the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality in Gauteng, South Africa. The name Soweto is an acronym for 'Southwestern Township'. Developed as an area for people of colour under South Africa's apartheid system, Soweto has evolved into a place of pride and social prestige, filled to the brim with vibrant culture and incredible history. Visitors can explore the bustling Vilakazi Street, catch a show at the Soweto Theatre, sample local cuisine at one of the many traditional restaurants and enjoy a South African beer at a local shebeen. Must-see historical sites include Kliptown, the Hector Petersen Memorial and Museum, and the former home of President Nelson Mandela. Thrill-seekers shouldn't miss a chance to bungee jump 100 metres from a suspension bridge at the famed Orlando Towers bungee jump.



Mandela House

Mandela House is a museum in the heart of Soweto, South Africa. It was the former home of Nelson Mandela, a freedom fighter and South Africa's first democratically elected president. The museum offers a glimpse into the life and struggles of Mandela and the apartheid era. Visitors can explore the rooms, including the living room, kitchen and bedroom, and see family photos and personal belongings. The museum also has an exhibition on the history of Soweto, including the 1976 student uprising. A visit to Mandela House is a moving and educational experience, providing a powerful reminder of South Africa's fight for freedom and the legacy of its most famous son.



Sakhumzi Restaurant

The Restaurant is situated on the popular & historic Vilakazi Street, in Orlando West suburb of Soweto in Johannesburg. Vilakazi Street is host to original homes of Nelson Mandela and Bishop Tutu, not least it also hosts the site upon which Hector Peterson (the 13yr old) as 1st victim of Soweto Student Uprisings was shot dead by Apartheid police.

As a result of the restaurant's location on Vilakazi Street which is at the epicentre of tourism in Soweto/Johannesburg the restaurant caters primarily for foreign tourist market and blue-chip corporate (team-building) group bookings. This target market informs the nature of ambience & cuisine offered by the restaurant. The cuisine is African township whilst the ambience aspires to complement heritage tourism theme.



Voortrekker Monument

The Voortrekker Monument, completed in 1949, is a historic and iconic monument in Pretoria. It was erected to commemorate the Afrikaner pioneers (Voortrekkers) and their journey during the Great Trek in the 1830s. The monument's architecture is striking and symbolic, featuring a central Cenotaph Hall and a 360-degree marble frieze. Visitors can explore its museum, learn about Afrikaner history, and enjoy panoramic views of Pretoria from the top.

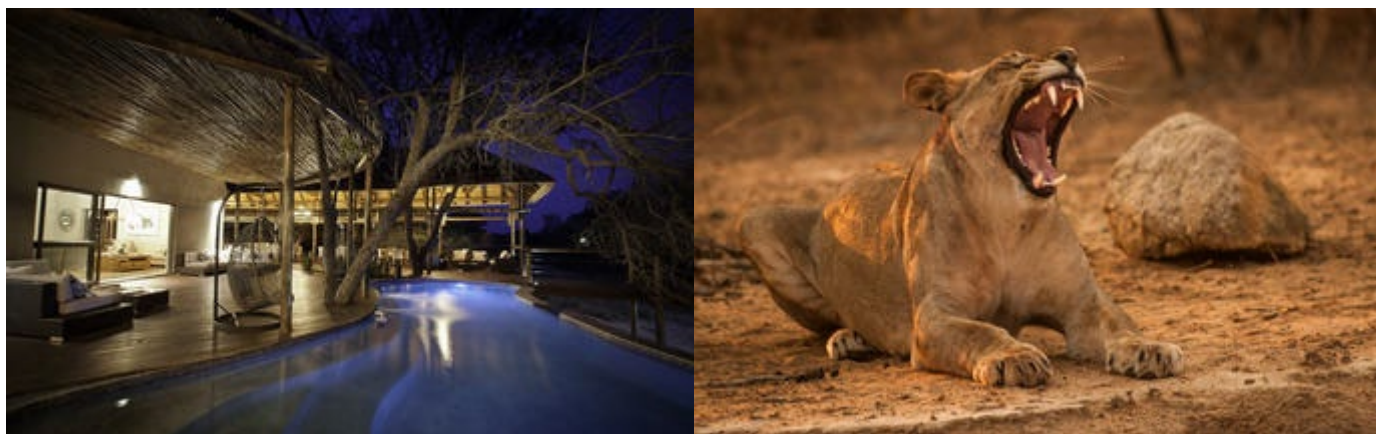

On 16 June 1976 in the Johannesburg township of Soweto, what began as a peaceful march in the name of educational reforms turned to chaos when police troops responded to the demonstrating students with a barrage of

live bullets and teargas. One of the most tragic casualties of this debacle was 13-year-old Hector Pieterse, who was killed when he was caught in the crossfire. The Hector Museum, located close to the site of his death, was built to commemorate his untimely passing and the events that ultimately caused it.

Circe Launches Seal Island Cruise

Circe Launches Seal Island Cruise has a duration of between 40 and 60 minutes. Calypso, is the only glass bottomed open motorboat in South Africa, designed for passenger comfort and safety, with ample outside deck seating, upper deck viewing and comfortable inside cabin seating. During good visibility, passengers are able to get a first-hand view of the kelp forests and the abundant sea life at Duiker Island/Seal Island. The boat's powerful engines enable crew to bring the vessel within metres of the island, for a really close up view of the Cape fur seals in their natural environment.

Boulders Penguin Colony

Boulders Penguin Colony is located near Cape Town, South Africa. This popular tourist attraction offers visitors the chance to observe African penguins at close range and learn more about them. The section also includes three boardwalks that provide easy access to the beach area, and sheltered areas for viewing the birds.



Cape Point

Cape Point is a spectacular sight, covered in endemic fynbos and home to breathtaking bays, beaches and rolling green hills and valleys, just 60km outside of Cape Town. Cape Point falls within the Cape Floral Region, a World Heritage Site. The Cape Floral Region is one of the richest areas for plants in the world – it is home to nearly 20% of Africa’s flora. Cape Point is open daily and is must-see.



Cape Point Funicular

The Flying Dutchman funicular takes visitors at Cape Point up to the lighthouse, where there is an outstanding view of the point and ocean. The funicular is named after a ghost ship whose destiny it is to sail the oceans forever. More information can be found at the museum.

GOLD Restaurant

GOLD Restaurant is a vibrant pan-African experience offering a set Cape Malay and African menu, together with live entertainment and djembe drumming 7 nights a week. Operating from an old warehouse building and a modern function venue, GOLD offers visitors a sophisticated African experience.

Enjoy an award-winning, 14-dish tasting menu inspired by ingredients and textures from all over the African continent. Be seduced by live dancing and singing to the rhythmic beating of African djembe drums. Feel part of their tribal community with some optional pre-dinner drumming under the guidance of an experienced facilitator.

Day 7: De Zalze Lodge, Stellenbosch (Sat, 14 June)

Day Itinerary

After breakfast and check out, enjoy a short city orientation tour inclusive of a walk-through Bo-Kaap.

Bo-Kaap is a neighbourhood in Cape Town set on the slopes of Signal Hill and was originally established by members of the Cape Malay community who were brought to Cape Town during the 18th century as slaves. Bo-Kaap is known for its brightly coloured homes, beautiful mosques and vibrant culture. It is a popular tourist attraction and one of the most photographed areas in Cape Town. Visitors can explore the area on foot or take a guided tour to learn about its history and culture. Bo-Kaap is also home to many restaurants, cafes and shops offering traditional cuisine and handmade crafts from local artisans.

Afterwards, head to Table Mountain for a birds-eye view of the Mother City. Following Table Mountain, enjoy a return ferry ride to Robben Island before making your way to Stellenbosch and check in at your hotel for 2-night stay.

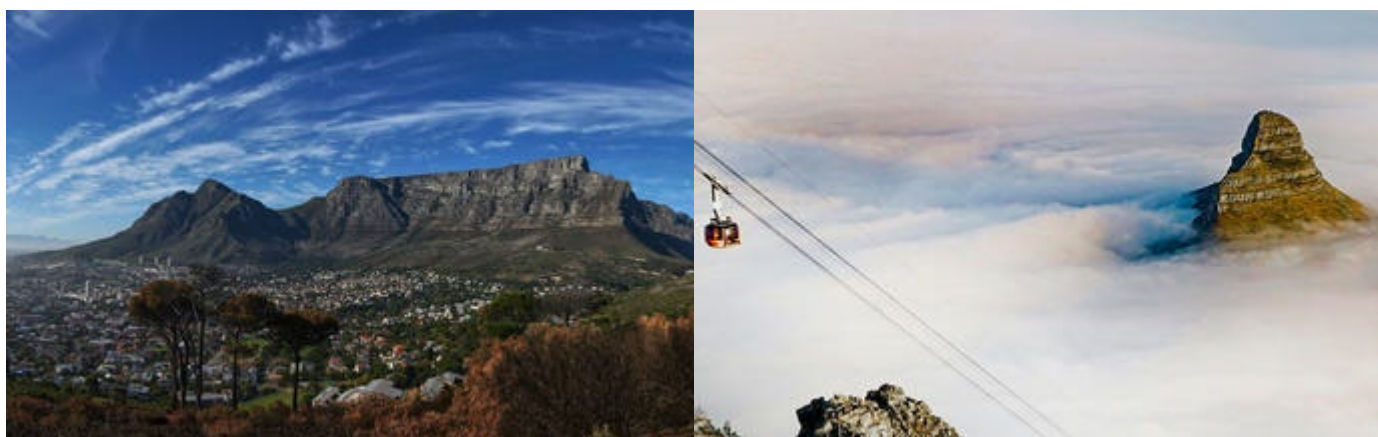

Table Mountain

Table Mountain is the most iconic landmark of South Africa. Aside from being the country's most photographed attraction and the perfect place to take photos of the landscape of Cape Town, it is also home to about 2,200 species of plants and 1,470 floral species, many of which are endemic to the mountain. Animal species that can be spotted on the mountain include caracals, rock hyraxes and chacma baboons. The flat top peak of the mountain reaches 1,086 metres above sea level but being so close to the sea and to the city, its features look more imposing.



Robben Island

Robben Island is located in Table Bay, just off the coast of Cape Town, South Africa. The island is a UNESCO World Heritage Site renowned for its profound historical significance. Notably, the attraction is known for the prison where Nelson Mandela was held for 18 of his 27 years of imprisonment. Visitors can explore the prison museum, take guided tours led by former inmates, and learn about the island's rich history and its role in South Africa's journey to democracy.



Helena's Restaurant at Coopmanhuijs Boutique Hotel and Spa

Helena's Restaurant aims to serve heritage food with finesse, often with a subtle twist in detail, turning the familiar into the spectacular. The menu is designed to reflect the bounty of the Cape, with specific emphasis on freshness and food provenance. At Helena's, good unpretentious food and special wine add to the pleasures of life. The restaurant is located in two adjoining dining areas within Coopmanhuijs. The first area, beneath an antique yellow-wood ceiling, is appointed with richly embossed French wallpaper. Lighted trees – intricately made of wire – adorn

an entire wall. In the second dining area, hand-hewn poplar dining chairs are set beneath the glass roof of a charming conservatoire, which opens onto the enclosed courtyard and swimming-pool.

Day 8: De Zalze Lodge, Stellenbosch (Sun, 15 June)

Day Itinerary

Today you enjoy a full day out in the Cape Winelands, starting off with a Stellenbosch orientation tour including a visit to Oom Samie se Winkel.

Three wine tastings included through the day, at 3 different wine estates. Lunch is for own account.

In the afternoon, end of the day with a Franschhoek orientation tour, before enjoying dinner at The French Connection Bistro.

Set just over an hour from Cape Town, within the inspiring landscapes of the Cape Winelands, Franschhoek is a heritage town and a world-renowned food and wine destination. Travellers could choose to focus their visit on any one aspect alone - nature, cuisine or culture - and find plenty to keep them busy. The estates here attract wine experts from around the globe with their Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Cap Classique sparkling wine (among others). Five-star restaurants alongside the cellars are surrounded by the same jaw-dropping valley scenes that have brought artists and writers to the area for centuries. A superb literary festival takes place around May every year, and, combined with the town's Cape Dutch manor houses, fascinating museums, and charming boutiques, makes

Franschhoek a wonderful place to visit in winter. Summer provides endless hiking, cycling and other outdoor opportunities among the lush farmlands and mountains.

Oom Samie se Winkel

Step back in time at Oom Samie se Winkel, a historic general store in Stellenbosch. Founded in 1904, this family-run shop offers a unique glimpse into the past. Browse shelves stocked with everything from vintage keepsakes and handcrafted goods to traditional South African treats like biltong and rooibos tea. Don't miss the fresh local produce, aromatic spices, and jams. Oom Samie's even has a restaurant for a light meal and a wine boutique for the perfect souvenir.



French Connection Bistro

French Connection Bistro is a casual, vibey, indoor and outdoor dining space popular with Franschhoek locals and tourists visiting this unique, small village. The bustling restaurant is fully air-conditioned for those long, hot summer days and has two fireplaces for cosy winter evenings. The restaurant also has two outside areas – the front verandah, where guests can watch the world go by, and the courtyard, a sheltered and quieter area at the back.

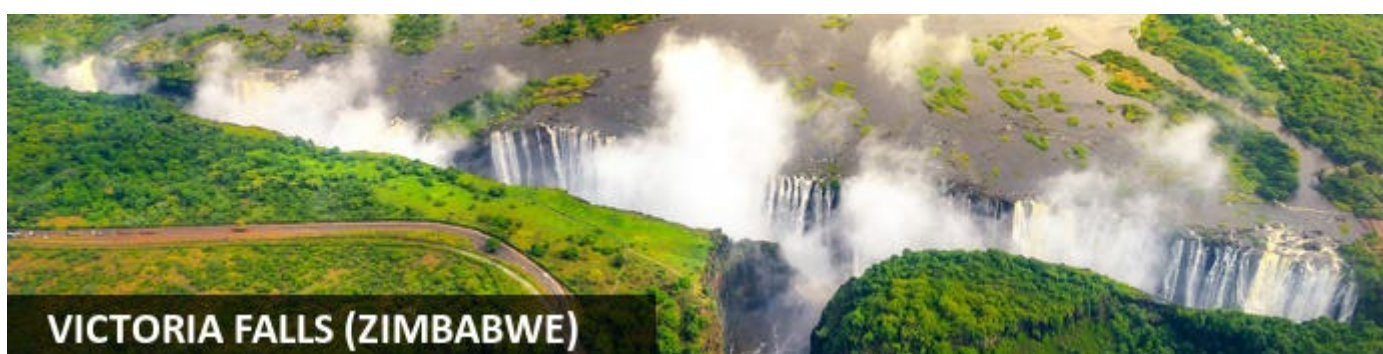

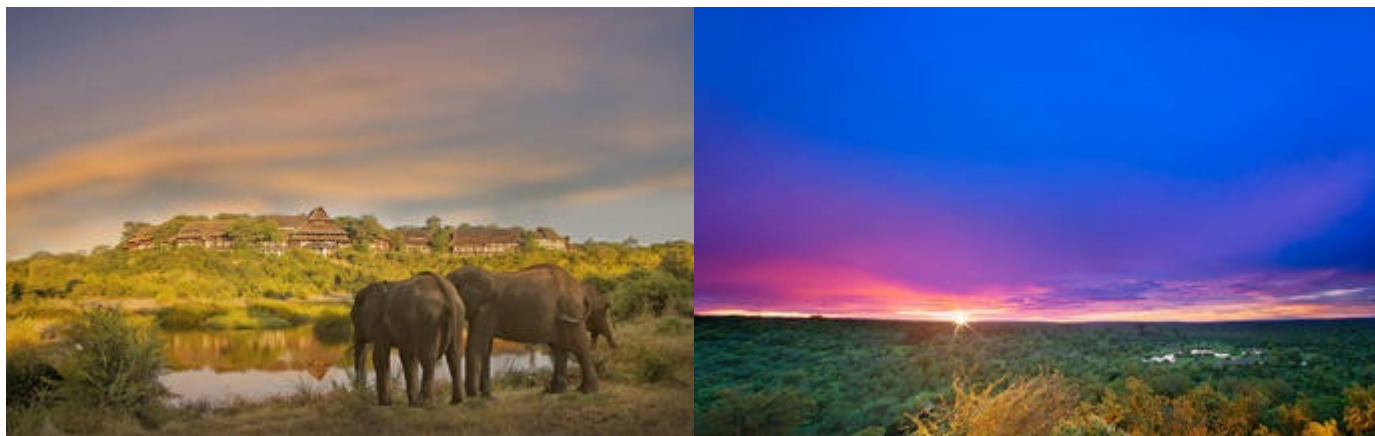
